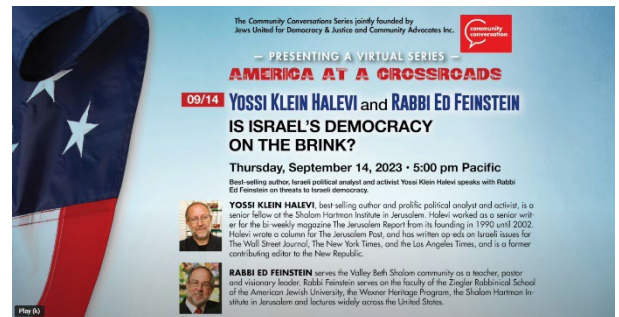

Hogarth is best known for his series paintings of 'modern moral subjects', of which he sold engravings on subscription. The Collection contains the set called 'Marriage A-la-Mode'. Although pugnaciously hostile to Continental art, he succumbed to French influence, and his Rococo-inspired collection of works led him to become widely revered as the first English Master.

Around the World: Trying 7 Soups From 7 Countries PLUS 7 Rice Dishes AND 7 Egg Dishes from Around the World

Soup's on. We searched far and wide to find how people enjoy their soup around the world. Among them: chanko nabe, a soup sumo wrestlers in Tokyo eat to bulk up; a bird's nest soup in San Pascual, Philippines, that, as its name implies, is made out of bird's nests; and ya-ka-mein, a soup served in New Orleans that is said to cure hangovers.

Next: If you see rice as a mere side dish, you are missing out on some delicious meals. We invite seven people in seven countries—from Mexico to Iran—to prepare rice-based dishes that are part of their nation's culinary identity. After sampling Finland's savory Karelian pie, Vietnam's bánh tét lá cẩm rice cakes stuffed with salted duck egg and dried shrimp and all of the other delicious food featured, we're confident you'll have a new appreciation for this simple grain.

Then: Not one chicken egg was cracked open in the making of this last episode. Instead, we talked to seven people in seven countries to find out what other kinds of eggs they like and how they make them. In South Africa, massive ostrich eggs are what's for breakfast, and they're hard to crack. Teeny, tiny, juicy snail eggs are an expensive treat in France. In Japan, octopus eggs are a delicacy, and duck eggs are the main ingredient in a yummy tea in Indonesia.

The Secrets Hidden Beneath Jupiter's Atmosphere

The Amazing Cassini spacecraft and its sibling lander, Huygens, have now concluded their scientific studies, bringing back years of data to be combed through by scientists, plotting their next journey to Saturn's space. Now, Juno piercing the cloak of Jupiter and her distant relative New Horizons at the edge of the solar system.

The Soviet Era Luna 3 was the first spacecraft to utilize gravity to change course to photograph the dark side of the Moon. The NASA Mariner 10 mission used the technique to swing by Venus to target Mercury. The gravity assist or slingshot maneuver has become a standard for navigating the solar system. With our probes reaching further, faster, and more accurately than ever before.
