The Jewish Musical Tradition in America

A Community Scholar Program Presentation



Tonight, we will delve into the rich and complex musical heritage of **Aaron Copland**, a seminal figure in American music. This session will explore Copland's unique synthesis of Jewish, American, and European influences, discuss his poignant work 'The Vitebsk Trio' which reflects on ambivalent memories, and celebrate his contributions to American music, particularly through his compositions honoring Abraham Lincoln.

Professor Howard Lupovitch is Professor of History and Director of the Cohn-Haddow Center for Judaic Studies at Wayne State University. He was educated at the University of Michigan, and Columbia University (earning a Ph.D. in History from the latter). Over his career, Prof. Lupovitch has taught at Cornell University, Colby College, the University of Western Ontario, and the University of Michigan, where he was also a fellow at the Frankel Institute for Advanced Judaic Studies. Prof. Lupovitch is the author, most recently, of *Transleithanian Paradise: A History of the Jewish Community of Budapest, 1738-1938*, and is presently completing a history of the Neolog Movement and researching a new history of the Jews of Detroit.

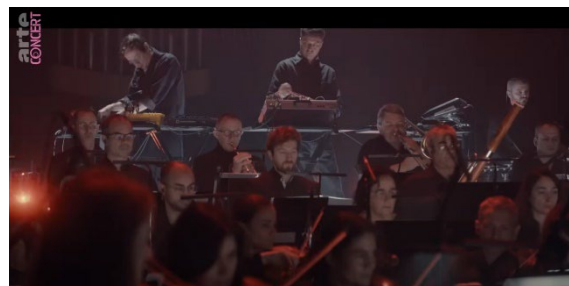

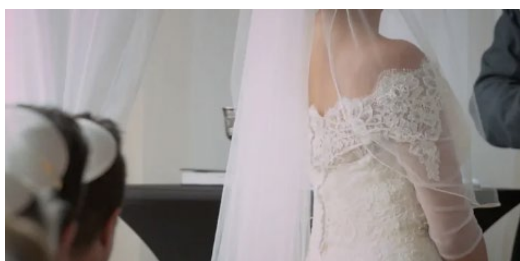

L(oo)ping: Arte Music Concert



With L(oo)ping, Rone takes us on a unique experience. An extraordinary project created by Louise Narboni, carried out with the Orchester National de Lyon and nine dancers. L(oo)ping is thus a unique film-object, which combines electronics, dance, symphonic music and many other surprises. From the recording of a concert by the electro composer Rone, given in December 2022 with the Orchester National de Lyon, the spectator of L(oo)ping escapes towards the impressionist worlds dreamed of by five choreographers, all witnesses of the representation: an usher, a spectator, a spectator, a technician and a musician. Thus begins an astonishing journey between the reality of the concert and a parallel universe sublimated by dance!
